Atlantic City, N. J., Sept. 2.—[Special.]—A white man and a negro today raced in the surf to the rescue of Miss Jennie Wyatt, a girl of about 20 years, who was caught in the current opposite Chelsea and was being carried out to sea.

The negro, a stalwart fellow and a strong swimmer, was first to reach her side. However, Miss Wyatt, who saw the white swimmer within a few strokes of her, although struggling for life, refused the assistance of the negro and waited until the other man reached her side.
